STILL PHOTOS



Our photos are taken with a DSLR camera and a wide-angle lens, our tried-and-true combo for capturing bright, high-definition shots of your home. We take several angles of each room so buyers browsing online can get a full sense of the space.

If there are areas you'd prefer not to have photographed, just let us know. We're happy to follow your lead (and your agent's!) on what best showcases your home.

During the appointment, we ask that you, your family, and your pets step out for a bit so we can move quickly and capture the best possible images without distractions. Don't worry—it doesn't take long!

3D VIRTUAL TOURS



For a virtual tour, we use a specialty 360-degree camera that scans each room and then stitches the images together to create an interactive 3D model of your home. To get a smooth, accurate result, it's important that everything in the home stays exactly as it is for every scan, which includes window coverings, doors, cabinets, and furniture. Keeping things consistent helps the camera align each space perfectly.

AERIAL MEDIA





Before the appointment, make sure your yard is free of clutter, toys, waste/recycling bins, and vehicles. Because the drone captures both your home and the surrounding area, this is your chance to have your landscaping and outdoor spaces looking their best.

We're fully licensed with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), which means we're cleared to legally and safely operate drones for real estate purposes. This is an important distinction, as hiring an unlicensed individual can cost you tens of thousands of dollars in fines.


APPOINTMENT PREPARATION


We've broken everything down into sections to make it easier to digest, so take it one step (or room) at a time. You've got this!



ENTRY

ENTRY

Wipe down the interior and exterior of the front door
Sweep and mop hard floors
Dust any entry tables and decor
Sweep front porch
Fluff and wipe down any outdoor furniture
Ensure door mat is free of dust and not overly worn. Replace if needed.




LIVING ROOM

LIVING ROOM

Clear surfaces, removing magazines, books, remotes, and tablets
Fluff throw pillows and neatly lay any decorative blankets
Vacuum carpets or sweep and mop hard floors
Dust fireplace mantels, shelves, TV, lamps, & tables
Hide excess cables and cords
Remove video game consoles
Center rugs and make sure edges are flat
Remove family photos or personal items
Replace dead lightbulbs ensuring bulb tones match
Wipe fingerprints from glass surfaces, TV screens, and mirrors
Tuck away pet beds, toys, and scratching posts

LIVING ROOM (CONT'D)

Clean the interior and exterior glass on the fireplace
Ensure HVAC vents are clean and free of dust
Steam curtains for a wrinkle-free look
Vacuum cloth sofas and chairs
Wipe down leather furniture




KITCHEN

KITCHEN

Clear everything from countertops, including small appliances, drying racks and cutting boards
Remove everything including magnets, papers, and artwork from the outside of the refrigerator
Remove any items from the top of the refrigerator
Sweep and mop hard floors
Wipe down countertops, appliances, hardware, backsplash, and faucets
Clear any dishes, sponges, brushes, and soap from the sink
Wipe down the kitchen table and chairs
Remove high chairs and booster seats
Dust light fixtures and wipe glass pendants if applicable
Organize pantry (a great time to toss expired food!)
Remove dish towels from oven handles

KITCHEN(CONT'D)

Empty & hide trash cans and recycling bins
Make sure all lights are on and bulbs match in color temperature
Straighten barstools & chairs so they're evenly spaced
Ensure all cabinet doors and drawers close completely
Remove pet bowls and hide pet food




BATHROOMS

BATHROOMS

Clear everything from countertops (limit decor to one or two simple, neutral items)
Remove all personal toiletries, makeup, toothbrushes, and products from counters
Reduce items in shower, throwing away any empty bottles
Remove toilet brushes, plungers, Squatty Potty™ (or similar), training toilets, and trash bins
Ensure the shower curtain is clean, wrinkle-free, and left partially open
Ensure cabinet doors and drawers can close completely
Limit floor to one clean bath mat
If bath mat is worn or dirty, store away for appointments.
Wipe down counters, mirrors, shower/bath, toilet, and all hardware until streak-free
Sweep and mop hard floors
Hang no more than two clean, matching, neutral (preferably white) towels on the towel rack

BATHROOMS (CONT'D)

Hang no more than one clean, neutral (preferably white) hand towel on towel ring
Ensure toilet paper is filled and not unrolled
Make sure all lights are on and bulbs match in color temperature
Remove bath toys
Remove hard water stains from glass materials



BEDROOMS

BEDROOMS


Make beds with smooth, tightly pulled linens and neatly arranged pillows
Clear tops of nightstands, dressers, and desks (limit decor to one or two simple items)
Dust light fixtures, ceiling fans, and all flat surfaces
Vacuum carpets or sweep and mop hard floors
Remove items from under the bed unless fully hidden by a bed skirt
Organize walk-in closets (if applicable)
Remove all laundry & full hampers from view
Unplug and store chargers, cords, and personal electronics
Remove televisions (unless wall-mounted), computers, and video game consoles
Replace any burnt-out bulbs and ensure all lighting matches in color temperature
Remove personal photos and keepsakes



LAUNDRY ROOM

LAUNDRY ROOM


Remove laundry baskets, hampers, and visible piles of clothing (clean or dirty!)
Ensure both washer and dryer are empty
Wipe down washer, dryer, counters, sink, and cabinet faces
Empty lint traps
Sweep and mop floors
Remove trash cans and cleaning tools from view
Organize detergents and laundry supplies in an orderly manner



HOME OFFICE

HOME OFFICE

Remove all personal identifiers including mail, paperwork, photos, etc.
Clear desks and bookshelves of clutter
Dust all surfaces, including monitors and lamps
Hide or neatly bundle computer cords, chargers, and power strips
Remove sticky notes, calendars, and personal documents from view
Vacuum carpets or sweep and mop hard floors
Ensure cabinets and drawers close completely
Turn computer off



EXTERIOR

EXTERIOR (COLD MONTHS)


Shovel and clear driveways, sidewalks, patios, and decks of all snow and ice
Apply ice melt as needed to ensure surfaces are safe and clear
Check that porch lights and fixtures are clean and working
Brush snow off exterior decor, potted plants, or doormats
Remove children's toys, pet toys, and animal waste
Store trash and recycling bins neatly in the garage or along the side of the house (out of view)
Put away landscaping tools, shovels, and snow blowers
Move above-ground trampolines to a back corner of the yard (if feasible)
Remove moveable basketball hoops from the front of the home
Wash exterior windows if weather permits

EXTERIOR (WARM MONTHS)

Mow the lawn and edge along sidewalks and driveways
Pull weeds and remove dead plants
Rake leaves, branches, and debris from the yard
Trim overgrown trees, shrubs, and bushes
Remove fallen fruit from the ground (if applicable)
Clear window wells of leaves and debris
Wash exterior windows if needed
Power wash or wipe down siding, garage doors, and exterior doors if dirty
Sweep driveways, walkways, and patios
Make sure porch lights and exterior fixtures are clean and working
Remove children's toys, pet toys, and animal waste

EXTERIOR (WARM MONTHS)

Move above-ground trampolines to a back corner of the yard
Remove moveable basketball hoops from the front of the home
Store trash and recycling bins neatly in the garage or along the side of the house (not visible from the street)
Put away landscaping tools, hoses, and shovels
Tidy up outdoor furniture
Clear cobwebs, nests, and any signs of critters and pests



MISCELLANEOUS


MISCELLANEOUS

Replace any burnt-out bulbs and ensure all lighting matches in color temperature
Wipe down interior windows, mirrors, and blinds
Remove items from window sills and clean tracks
Remove personal identifiers (family photos, private paperwork, addressed mail, etc.)
Store valuables, including jewelry, firearms, ammunition, and collectibles, in a safe or off-site location
Minimize furniture and décor where possible to make rooms feel open and spacious
Remove dead or wilted houseplants
Remove space heaters, standing fans, and humidifiers
Ensure all cabinet doors and drawers close completely (adjust hinges if needed)
Set thermostat to a comfortable temperature before your showing appointments
Turn off televisions, ceiling fans, and music

MISCELLANEOUS

	Eliminate strong odors by avoiding cooking, burning candles, or using air fresheners right before the appointment
	Dust baseboards
	Wipe down doorknobs
	Do a final walk-through of your home to check for anything distracting or out of place

FINAL INSTRUCTIONS



Utilize your storage spaces.

Photos are not taken inside drawers or cabinets, so feel free to use these areas to store personal items or anything you don't want visible in photos.

Downsize ahead of time.

Sell or donate items before moving, and do so before your appointment. Remove appliances, toys, décor, and clothing you no longer plan to keep so your home looks clean and spacious. Consider a monthly storage space if you have excess items. You are planning on moving anyway, so get the process started sooner rather than later.

Avoid overlapping appointments.

Please do not schedule other services (like cleaners, landscapers, or contractors) on the same day as your photography appointment. These tasks often take longer than expected and can delay or interfere with your session. Try to complete all other prep work prior to photo day.

Preparation WILL take longer than you expect.

Preparing and staging your home takes effort. If you feel your home won't be ready, we're happy to reschedule, even the evening before or morning of your appointment. There's no fee to cancel or adjust your time. We want you to be thrilled with your photos! A few extra days of preparation can save you weeks or even months sitting on the market.

Keep an eye on the weather.

Our photographers work rain or shine, and will photograph both the interior and exterior of your home as scheduled. However, if poor weather is predicted and you'd prefer to wait for better conditions, feel free to reschedule.

WHY IT MATTERS

Countertops

We recommend clearing kitchen counters for two reasons:

- A clutter-free space creates a cleaner, more modern look in photos.
- Items left on counters make the kitchen look like it lacks storage.

Fans & Space Heaters

While they may be practical, visible fans and space heaters can suggest poor air circulation or heating issues. Removing them helps buyers focus on the home's true features rather than possible concerns.

Pets

We know you love your pets — we do too! But not all buyers are animal lovers. Removing pet beds, food dishes, litter boxes, and toys allows every buyer to imagine themselves in the space without distraction or unnecessary worry.

Personal Items & Valuables

You wouldn't normally announce what you own and where to find it on your social media, but that's essentially what you're doing if you're allowing valuables to be photographed while selling your home.

- Your listing photos will be online. Keeping personal identifiers out of sight helps protect your privacy.
- Storing valuables out of sight keeps them safe and doesn't announce to the world what they are or where they are located.
- Help buyers focus on the home itself, rather than the people who live in it.

Dust & Details

We love capturing close-up shots of the special touches that make your home stand out, like upgraded lighting, beautiful cabinetry, unique hardware, and more. A quick dusting ensures those features photograph at their best.

Shower Curtains

Leave shower curtains half open for photos. This shows off your fixtures and tile while keeping any personal items hidden behind the closed section. A fully closed curtain can make the room feel smaller and less inviting.

Child Safety

We encourage you to take down photos of your children as well as decor that may display their name. Again, photos of your home will be on the internet, and it's best to hide your children's personal identifiers as well as your own.
